## *Graduate Survey 2015: Graduates of Public and Private Institutions*

This report displays Graduate Survey 2015 findings and compare the responses of the graduates from public higher education institutions to the responses of graduates from private higher education Institutions.

The first section of the report discusses the working status of graduates of public institutions with the working status of graduates of private institutions. Then it displays the workings status by a number of variables such as gender and sector. It also presents the graduates' responses about the skills acquired from study, needed at work, and specifies the skills that graduates think they lack.

The second section of the report compares and discusses the differences in graduates' responses based on their year of graduation 2010/2009 or 2013/2012 using different variables such as working status, sector. Gender...etc. The main points highlighted in the report are summarized below:

- ◆ The percentage of employed graduates from public institutions is higher than those from private institutions.
- ◆ Male graduates from both public and private institutions are more employed than female graduates.
- ◆ The quality of institutional services in private educational institutions was rated higher by graduates than the quality of services in public educational institutions.
- ◆ More graduates of public educational institutions were trained before graduation than those of private educational institutions.
- ◆ Graduates of 2009/2010 were more employed than the graduates of 2012/2013 for both those who graduate from public and private institutions.
- ◆ Public institutions graduates are more paid than private institutions graduates.
- ◆ The monthly wages of 88.4 % of employed graduates from public institutions ranged between 601 O.R and 1800 O.R.
